



Hangklip-Kleinmond Itinerary

1Day

- 07h00: Depart from Cape Town travel N2-road to Gordon's Bay. Travel along scenic Clarence Drive (R44-road from Gordon's Bay) to the **Cape Whale Coast**.
- 08H00: The Stony Point Penguin Colony is located adjacent to Wallers Way in Betty's Bay, here a representative of the Hangklip-Kleinmond Tourism Bureau will meet you. Stony Point is a unique land-based colony and is one of three mainland colonies where the African Penguin can be found. **Stony Point Penguin Colony: 028 272 9829**
- 09h15: The Harold Porter Botanical Garden, this tranquil Garden set between mountain and sea in Betty's Bay, is located within the Kogelberg Biosphere Reserve, a floral hotspot in the heart of the fynbos region. You will be given a guided tour of this unique setting. **Harold Porter Botanical Garden: 028 272 9311**
- 10h00: Drive to the Kogelberg Eco Cabins situated in the Kogelberg Biosphere Nature Reserve, here refreshments will be served. View these modern cabins that are surrounded with breath taking views. **Kogelberg Biosphere Reserve: Tania – 028 271 5138**
- 10h45: Visit the new office of the Hangklip-Kleinmond Tourism Bureau situated on the Main Road in Kleinmond. Here you will be able to see specimens of some of the fynbos found in the Hangklip-Kleinmond area and interesting displays. **Hangklip-Kleinmond Tourism Bureau: Anecia – 028 271 5657**
- 11h30: Drive to Harbour Road known for its colorful buildings, Walk and bourse the various Art & Pottery Galleries, unique shops & restaurants.
- 11h45: Make you way to the one of the restaurants where lunch will be served, enjoy the view while sipping on the Harbour Road Wine.
- 13h00: Depart for Hermanus, the whale capital. Travel on the R43-route towards Hermanus.





- 13h45: With a unique tasting to be done in the cellar with a selection of wines in hand. A representative of the Hermanus Tourism Bureau will be meeting you.
- 14h00 Depart for Rotary Way. Here you might be able to view Whales and be told about Walker bay ocean reserve (whales can be observed in season).
- 14h45 SANSA (The South African National Space Agency), the facility is situated in Hermanus this used to be called the Hermanus Magnetic Observatory. This facility monitors and provides early warnings on space weather close to Earth. This includes solar storms, solar winds and disturbances in the ionosphere. **SANSA: 028 312 1196**
- 15h:40 Arrive at Hermanus Tourism Bureau, where refreshments will be served.

- 16h45: Fernkloof Nature Reserve is your last stop on the majestic tour of the Cape Whale Coast. The reserve lies on the northern side of the town with a 60 km network of trails. These provide the opportunity for people of all fitness levels to go out and enjoy some exercise and fresh air. A display of some of the flowers that can be found in the veld is permanently maintained at the Fernkloof Visitors' Centre. The various trails offer magnificent and unequalled views of Walker Bay, the Hemel en Aarde Valley and Maanskynbaai. **Fernkloof Nature Reserve: 028 312 2629**
