



ITINERARY – 1 DAY

08:30	Arrive at Hermanuspietersfontein fountain on the seafront
08:30 – 09:00	Take a leisurely stroll on the Hermanus Biodiversity Walk up to Gearing’s Point. The walk is informative and self-guided. Twenty information nodes provide information on the multiple components that constitute the natural biodiversity. Keep a look out for the Southern Right Whale while walking the cliff path.
09:00 – 09:30	Arrive at Gearing’s Point. Gearing’s Point is a well-known lookout point for land based whale watching. The Southern Right Whale visits Hermanus between May and December to mate and calve.
09:30 – 10:00	Visit the Old Harbour Museum. The Old Harbour Museum encompasses the whole harbour as well as in indoor area. The harbour was declared a museum in 1972. It is now a well-known national heritage site in Hermanus.
10:00 – 11:00	Arrive at the South African Shark Conservancy (SASC). SASC is an NGO dedicated to promoting the conservation and sustainable use of living marine resources through research, education and outreach. Their research is focused on sharks and their habitat.
11:00 – 12:30	Visit Heart of Abalone to learn more about abalone, a local delicacy from the sea, as well as the conservation side of the Abalone.
12:30 – 13:30	Enjoy lunch at Harbour Rock Restaurant in the New Harbour.
13:30 – 14:30	Visit the Fernkloof Nature Reserve which comprises 0.002% of the Cape Floral Kingdom but contains 18% of its plants in just 18 square kilometres. There is no other place on earth where so many different species can be seen growing in such close proximity.
14:30 – 15:00	Scenic drive up Rotary Way which is part of the Fernkloof Nature Reserve. Enter the Hermanus Wine Route via Hamilton Russell Vineyards.
15:00 – 16:00	Wine tasting at Bouchard Finlayson which is situated on the Hermanus Wine Route
