HERMANUS CLIFF PATH

Walk 12 kilometers from the New Harbour to Grotto Beach or any part thereof. Learn about the galaxy from the scaled exhibition of the solar system that is on the route, also appreciate the outdoor sculpture exhibition of Hermanus FynArts.

SANSA

The South African National Space Agency offers a free hour-long tour every Wednesday from 11:00 till 12:00 in Hermanus.



WINE & FOOD

WHALES

From June till November the Southern Right Whales are here and Walker Bay is converted into a big whale maternity room. Watch them from the land, sky or a boat. While the Southern Right Whales are very seasonal the Humpback and Brydes Whales have a tendency to surprise visitors all year round.
